The HEIT B60- Human Form and Function class is a college level course that is transferable to both UC and CSU and satisfies the General Education Biological Sciences requirement. #### HEIT B60 Course description:

1. Introduction to the structure and function of the human body Includes structural components, spatial relationships, and body system interactions. 1. Upon completion of the course students will successfully name the systems of the human body, their general functions, the major organs that make up these systems and the general contribution each organ makes to the system.
2. 2. Upon completion of the course students will successfully locate and identify the major organs of the human body systems.
3. 3. Upon completion of the course students will successfully describe the basic components of tissue types used to make up the major organs of the human body.
4. 4. Upon completion of the course students will successfully use anatomical and directional language to identify body parts, positions, cavities, planes and sections as commonly used in medical practice.
5. 5. Upon completion of the course students will successfully retrieve, evaluate, and use information regarding the human body and medicine to make informed decisions about issues relevant to their everyday lives and the world
6. 6. Upon completion of the course students will successfully learn and practice study and problem-solving skills either in groups and or individually

#### PBHS B20 Course Description

This course provides an introduction to the discipline of Public Health. Students will gain an understanding of the basic concepts and terminologies of public health, as well as the history and accomplishments of public health officials and agencies. The course will provide an overview of the functions of various public health professions and institutions, and an in-depth examination of the core public health disciplines. Topics will include epidemiology of infectious and chronic disease; prevention and control of diseases in the community including the analysis of the social determinants of health and strategies for eliminating disease; illness and health disparities among various populations; community organizing and health promotion programming; environmental health and safety; global health; and healthcare policy and management.
